THE PHOENIX ANTI-TRAFFICKING PROGRAM

The London Abused Women's Centre provides sexually-exploited and trafficked women and girls over the age of 12 with:

- Long-term, woman-centered, trauma-informed counselling, support, advocacy, safety planning and exit plans
- Transitional support and system navigation to access income support, substance use and mental health counselling, education and job training
- Prevention groups to increase awareness about recruitment tactics, luring, and trafficking to prevent exploitation of at-risk girls, youth, and women
- Support accessing safe housing
- Support for families of trafficked and sexually-exploited girls and women

Services are available for up to three years. For survivors located outside of London services are offered virtually by phone or by Zoom. All services are offered at no cost.

JOURNEY TO JUSTICE: Equitable Access to Justice For Trafficked Women, Girls, and Youth

The London Abused Women's Centre, in collaboration with Youth Opportunities Unlimited, and Salvation Army Correctional and Justice Services, provides survivors of sex trafficking and sexual exploitation with counselling, advocacy and support to seek equitable access to justice through the following options:

- Support accessing the justice system to report traffickers; support to testify, safety plan, and complete victim impact statements; provide court accompaniment where possible, criminal justice system literacy to make informed decisions, and support throughout lengthy, difficult court processes;
- Support to seek alternatives to reporting to police/court through anonymous reporting; accessing victim compensation; pursuing civil litigation and/or funding for financial stability, housing, basic needs or therapy and services;
- Support to take social justice action to raise awareness of trafficking and supports for victims/survivors (e.g., peer mentor training; speaking out about their experience); and
- Support for victims/survivors with trauma-informed, survivor/victim-centered, cross-sectoral, wrap-around supports, resources, tools to empower themselves to heal, recover and rebuild their lives.

Support to pursue options of seeking compensation/therapy or taking social justice action provides alternative pathways for victims/survivors to seek resolution and desired outcomes. Survivors report feeling empowered and supported to heal, recover, and regain independence and control over their lives.
